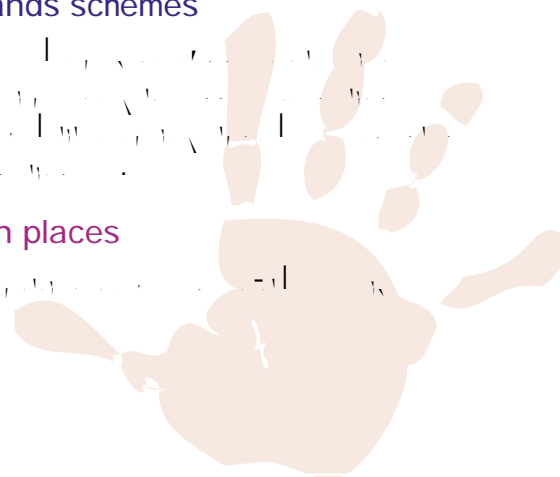
Child Tax Credit is a tax credit for parents of children under 16. It is available to those on a low income and is paid in regular instalments. It can be used to help pay for a child's education and other expenses.

Helping hands schemes

Helping hands schemes are voluntary organisations that provide support and advice to parents and carers. They offer a range of services, including financial advice, counselling, and help with childcare arrangements. They are often funded by local authorities and other organisations.

Part-time early education places

Part-time early education places are available for children aged 2 to 4. They provide a structured environment where children can learn and play with other children. These places are often funded by local authorities and can be used to help parents manage their work and childcare responsibilities.



Childcare Vouchers

Childcare vouchers are a way of paying for childcare. They are a type of salary sacrifice arrangement where you give up some of your salary in return for vouchers that you can use to pay for childcare.

Extra Financial Help

There are a number of ways you can get extra financial help for childcare. This includes the Child Tax Credit, the Working Tax Credit, the Universal Credit, and the Childcare Grant. You can also get help with the cost of childcare through your employer's childcare voucher scheme.

Child Maintenance

Child Maintenance is a way of ensuring that non-resident parents pay for the care and maintenance of their children. It is a legal obligation for non-resident parents to pay child maintenance for their children who are under 16 years old.
